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Here's What we are Learning!

Reading

Your child should be able to read and sound out short vowel words and beginning blends (cvc words). We are now working on reading words with digraphs (two letters that make one sound-sh, ch, th, wh, ph). Our stories this month focus around the winter season. Continue to practice reading at home with your child. They should be able to read short vowel words and all their sight words in their books.

Math

We will finish up Unit 4 and begin Unit 5. In Unit 4 we formally introduced addition! Learning addition and subtractions facts is a major focus of first grade math. In Unit 5 we will begin to use larger numbers and explore place value. We will use base 10 blocks to represent numbers and to demonstrate their understanding of place value with tens and ones. We will also compare numbers with <, >, and =.

Reminders

Please remember to have your child read <u>EVERY</u> <u>NIGHT!</u> You can read to them or better yet they can read to you. Don't forget to record the story in their agenda, found in their G.O.
