Workshop Description: This presentation is an overview of the evidence-based practices based on the research literature and the reports of the National Professional Development Center for Autism Spectrum Disorders and the National Autism Center. The presentation includes a summary of the research, an overview of each strategy and examples of implementation of the strategy. Strategies for evaluating claims of effectiveness of interventions are also discussed as well as ways that the strategies can be implemented in a school environment.

She is a certified behavior analyst and a BCBA-D—a Board Certified Behavior Analyst-Doctoral Level. Her mission is to develop practical applications of evidence-based interventions in schools and homes for students with ASD. She currently serves on the Panel of Professional Advisors for the Autism Society. She has written several books for children and for teachers & staff. She teaches autism, ABA, and single-subject research design graduate classes at Nova Southeastern University as adjunct faculty.
