WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:

“The unexamined life is not worth living” –Socrates

Socratic Questioning or The Socratic Method is defined as a pedagogical technique in which a teacher does not give information directly but instead asks a series of questions, with the result that the student comes either to the desired knowledge by answering the questions or to a deeper awareness of the limits of knowledge. During this workshop, participants will gain background knowledge about Socratic Questioning and critical thinking. In addition, Socratic Questioning and Socratic Circles will be modeled.

Participants will:

- * Discuss the critical role questioning plays in the mind of the educated person.
- * Discuss the importance of questioning in education.
- * Summarize the historical roots of the Socratic Method and the philosophy and practices of Socrates.
- * Create connections between Socratic questioning and critical thinking concepts.

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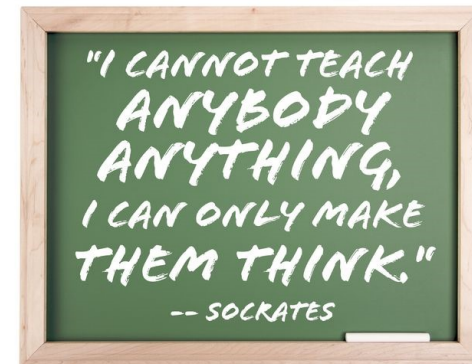
